MODULE THREE:

The Delta course will challenge you and broaden your horizons through exposing you to current thinking in TESOL. Advanced standing

- For eligible qualified ELICOS teachers, short term contracts (8 week sessional) will be awarded for the duration of the course.

CANCELLATIONS, TRANSFERS & REFUNDS

Full Refund

You are entitled to a full refund of fees (less the application fee) and charges where:

- · You are not accepted into the course.
- You decline the offer of a place on the course in writing a minimum of 10 working days after receipt of offer letter.
- Your written advice of withdrawal or transfer is received no later than 10 working days prior to course commencement.

You are entitled to a full refund (including the application fee) where:

- You are not given a place due to maximum number of places being reached
- If course is cancelled due to lack of applicant numbers, no available lecturer, or due to other circumstances caused by the Academy.

Part Refund

- Any refund will be made for withdrawals received in writing between 5 and 9 working days prior to course commencement is at the discretion of the Academy.
- No refund can be made for withdrawals received less than 5 working days prior to course commencement.

Pro Rata Refund

 A pro rata refund of fees and charges may be approved if an applicant withdraws for reasons of personal circumstances beyond their control. In all cases, relevant documentary evidence (for example, medical certificate) is required.

Refunds Following Re-marking

Students requesting a re-mark of their assessment should do so within four weeks of the date of publication of the results. Should a 'Not Yet Competent' candidate achieve an outcome of 'Competent' on a re-marking of the assessment, the \$25 remarking charge is to be refunded.
